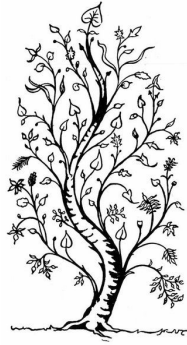


Project Niggle Part 2



So now each of you have shared your ‘leaves’ among your group – it’s time for the next step of the process that will take you from ‘leaf’ to ‘tree.’

For this step, you’ll be passing your leaf on to another group member -- it can be the person with whom you exchanged leaves in today’s class, or another person. Take the leaf that you have been given, and add a second leaf to it. You can choose to continue the ‘tale’ on the leaf you’ve been given, or you can write a tale that was inspired by it, or connects with it in terms of theme, character, or mood.

You will need to arrange a meeting with the person with whom you exchanged your leaves, and they with you, so that you can read what the other person has added to your story – this meeting should take place no later than this coming weekend.

Then, during the week that I will be away in Ireland and England (the first week of November), there will be a *third* phase to this project – your group will need to meet with another group and exchange all of its leaves with the other. The two groups of four (group 1 and group 2) will exchange with each other, while the three groups of three will exchange round-robin style:

Group 3 (Diebold, Hardiman, Propst) will give its leaves to Group 4 (Eminger Kneeland, Sexton); group 4 will give its leaves to Group 5 (Glantz, Lauriano, Silva), and Group 5 will give its leaves to Group 3.
