## Office of Residential Life and Housing First Year Student Information Sheet

A \$250 deposit can be paid online or at the Bursar's Office between February 1st and June 21<sup>st</sup> for placement in the first round of assignments. Deposits paid after June 21<sup>st</sup> will be accepted; however, students will be housed on a first come, first served basis until all spaces are filled.

First Year Students can fill out their roommate surveys from May 1st until June 21<sup>st</sup>. A roommate request must match by both individuals for the request to be granted. The Office of Residential Life and Housing does not accept suitemate requests. All entries are only requests. The Office of Residential Life and Housing does not guarantee building and roommate preferences will be granted.

The Housing Contract is for the entire academic year (fall and spring semesters). The contract must be canceled by August 1st to receive a refund for the upcoming year.
