

Naturalization Waiver for Applicants with a Disability

Naturalization applicants with a physical or developmental disability or mental impairment may seek a waiver of the English and/or U.S. history and government testing requirement(s) in the naturalization process.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) grants medical disability waivers to applicants who are medically impaired with an extreme condition or combination of conditions such that they are unable to learn or demonstrate knowledge of English and/or U.S. history and government.

USCIS regulations require that applicants submit the certification form, completed by a licensed medical doctor or a licensed clinical psychologist, along with a completed application for naturalization (Form N-400). This certification form will be used by USCIS to determine whether applicants for naturalization are entitled to an exception to the requirements.
