Caley currently serves as an outpatient psychologist, a member of the interdisciplinary crisis clinic team, and facilitator of the iFriend social skills group at Bradley Hospital in East Providence. Her research interests include program evaluation and implementation of preventative, positive approaches to parenting and schools.

Jennifer Hellmuth, PhD is a Brown University Psychology Postdoctoral Fellow at the Bradley School in Portsmouth. She earned her doctorate in School Psychology from Temple University, and prior to pursuing psychology she was a high school math teacher in the Washington, DC area. In her practice Jennifer focuses on consulting with teachers and related service professionals on best practices to support children, as well as supporting children with high-risk behaviors and trauma symptoms.
