We strive to make quality education affordable. The combination of our competitive tuition rates and generous financial aid programs make Rhode Island College the most affordable college in the Northeast.

While our tuition is lower than the majority of peer institutions in the region, the total cost of college depends on many factors. Those costs include both direct and indirect expenses. Direct expenses – for example, tuition and fees, and, for resident students, room and board – are paid directly to the college. Other costs, such as personal expenses, transportation expenses and, for commuting

Financial Aid Programs

The college uses information from the FAFSA along with anticipated costs associated with attendance to determine financial need. Aid is primarily offered through several federal and institutional programs, including the federal Pell grant, federal Direct student loans, federal work study and institutional grants and scholarships. A few of our highlighted programs are below. For students interested in any institutional funding, we encourage early submission of the FAFSA, since funding is limited and aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

Presidential Scholarships are awarded to applicants with the highest academic credentials and are renewable for up to three additional years. Interested students should submit their admissions applications by December 15 for priority consideration.

Honors Scholarships are available to new and returning students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement. Students should indicate their interest in the college's Honors Program on their admissions application.

Special Talent Awards are offered to students who have exceptional talent or skill in the visual and performing arts. Awards are offered in art, communication, dance, film, music and theatre. Interested students should contact the respective awarding academic departments.

Need-Based Grants and Scholarships are awarded to applicants based on financial need as determined by the FAFSA.

How to Apply

Students seeking financial assistance from the college should complete the FAFSA at *studentaid.ed.gov* by our posted deadlines and be sure to list our federal school code: 003407.

Admissions applications should be completed as soon as possible to ensure priority consideration for financial aid.
