This Academic Rhode Map is a semester-by-semester plan to help you toward graduation in four years. Not everyone graduates in four years, as it depends on how many courses you can take and how you do in those courses. This map is not your only route; it is a suggestion. You might take additional courses over the summer or early spring/winter to catch up or get ahead if the courses you need are offered at these times. While many courses in your major will have prerequisites that you will need to take in a special order, there is some flexibility in this map – but always double check that you have the correct prerequisites for a course you plan to take.

On the pages that follow, the column to the left suggests the ideal courses for you to take each semester. There are times when those courses may be full or unavailable the semester you plan to take them, in which case consider another course from a different semester with which you can switch. The column on the right has "Checkpoints" for each semester that show where you should be by the end of that semester. You should work from this map as you plan each semester's schedule, before checking in with your advisor. The Map is designed primarily for freshmen coming to college for the first time, but transfer students may also use the Rhode Map with the understanding that they have most likely completed several requirements through transfer of credit and will be starting further into the program. Transfer students seeking RIC Art program credit for studio courses completed at another college must submit a portfolio of artwork for review. Map assumes a Fall start.

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GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: The following requirements must be completed by all undergraduate degree candidates at Rhode Island College in order to graduate (**additional requirements for B.S. in Art Education degree are noted in bold**):

- General Education Requirements, including a Second Language Requirement, and 1-credit RIC 100 course or its equivalent.
- College Mathematics Competency (which is separate from the Gen Ed-Mathematics requirement).
- College Writing Requirement (satisfied by FYW with a minimum grade of C). **Education students need minimum grade of B for FYW.**
- Academic Major—**for B.S. in Art Educ.: Art, Education, and Art Education courses —see check chart above & on following pages.**
- A minimum of 120 credit hours, with a minimum of 45 credit hours taken at RIC. Of the 45 credit hours, a minimum of 15 credit hours must be in the major (12 of which must be at the 300- or 400-level). **For B.S. in Art Education degree: a minimum of 127 credits + 1 credit for RIC 100 course or its equivalent + 0-8 credits to fulfill Second Language Requirement.**
- A minimum overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0. **For B.S. in Art Educ.: a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 each semester.**
- **Completion of all required studio art and art history courses and all teacher education courses with a minimum grade of B-.**
- **Completion of ARTE 407 and ARTE 409, with a minimum grade of B for each course.**

NOTE: The total credit count for the major is 95 credits, and there are 40 credits for General Education; however, 8 Gen Ed credits will double count, which gives an overall total of 127 credits + 1 credit for RIC 100 and + 0-8 additional credits to fulfill the Second Language Requirement. The minimum credit count for earning a B.S. in Art Education will be 127 credits (without 1-credit RIC 100 or possible Second Language credits).
