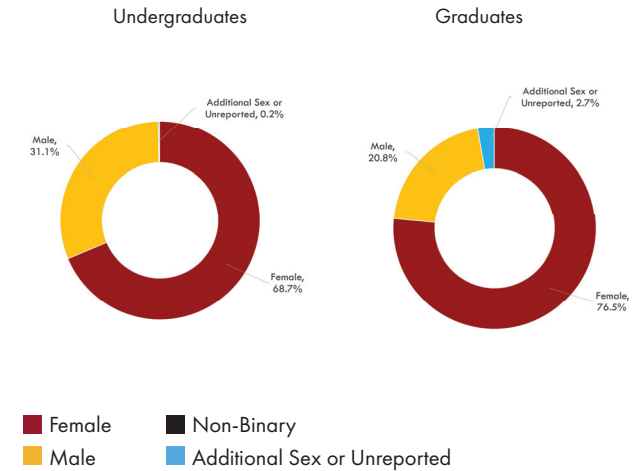

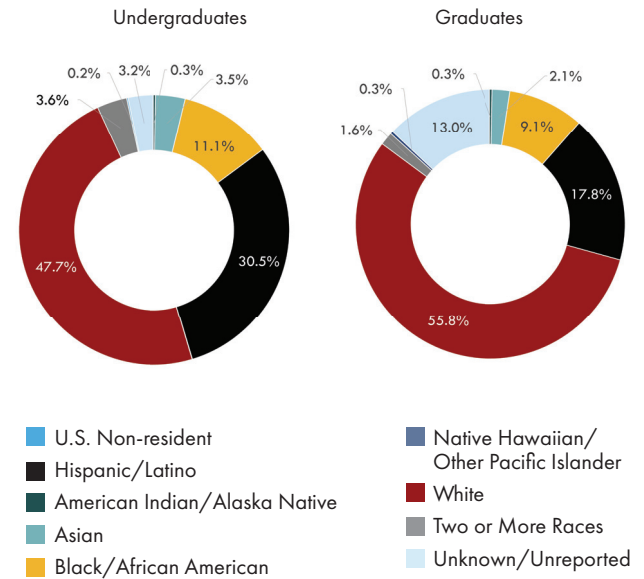

The federal graduation rate measures the percentage of entering first-time, full-time freshmen (FTFT) in the cohort year who manage to graduate within 150% of normal time. For 4-year (bachelor degree) institutions, this is also known as the 6-year-graduation rate, since 6 years is 150% of normal time for a 4-year degree.
