10-hour (1/2 time) CEP Dept. Graduate Assistantship

The CEP department consists of only graduate programs with robust enrollment in the Counseling and School Psychology programs. With national accreditation for the MS in Mental Health Counseling (CACREP) and the CAGS in School Psychology (NASP), program faculty work extensively with continuous quality improvement to maintain our rigorous standards.  - Assessment, evaluation and other continuous quality improvement initiatives.
 - Collection, review and reporting of program assessment information including graduate, supervisor, and employer survey information.
- 3) Addressing individual program needs for Counseling and School Psychology programs by:
 - Developing literature reviews for course modules and individual faculty research interests.
 - Gathering information to program improvement and grant preparation
 - Collecting materials and accessing resources for courses e.g. CEP 215 Educational Psychology.
- 4) Brainstorming and developing student focused materials for:
 - Attracting a diverse pool of students to the professions of Clinical Mental Health Counseling and School Psychology
 - Improving the CEP website to highlight program, faculty, and student accomplishments.
 - Tracking graduates to highlight their employment rates and professional successes.
 - Utilizing social media tools as a way to connect with professionals, alumni, supervisors, and the public about our programs.
 - Introducing new technological platforms and tools that will enhance our communications and marketing.
