PRIMARY PURPOSE:

Direct and coordinate field experiences associated with programs in the School of Social Work. Field experiences are related to the educational objectives off both the BSW and MSW programs. The Director of Field Experiences must be committed to and understand the generalist perspective.

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Essential Job Functions:

- Provide leadership in the establishment, maintenance and improvement of field experiences in Social Work.
- Develop field experiences that are consistent with generalist practices at the BSW level and reflect the generalist level in the first year of the MSW.
- Develop field experiences that are consistent with the advanced curriculum of the MSW program which reflect the generalist perspective in the advanced curriculum including the clinical track, and the organizing, policy and administration track.
- Develop field experiences that provide the necessary experiences for students who choose the dual track.
- Coordinate and administer all Social Work field experiences in off-campus settings including:
 - selection of field supervisors;
 - assignment of students to field placements;
 - o supervision of students when needed; and
 - development and implementation of orientation and professional development programs for agency supervisors.
- Develop innovative experimental agency-based field units.
- Provide information regarding the programs of the School to students and community agencies.

Occasional Job Functions:

Perform other duties and responsibilities as assigned by the Dean, School of Social Work.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATION STANDARDS:

Education:

MSW from a CSWE-accredited program.

Experience:

A minimum of five years post-MSW practice.

Skills, Knowledge and Abilities:

- Good understanding of both generalist and advanced practice.
- Strong oral and written communication skills.
- Good negotiation and interpersonal skills.
- Good computer skills.

PREFERRED:

- Teaching and administrative experience.
- Bilingual in English / Spanish (fluent in speaking and writing).
