

Initial Teacher Certification Programs

Testing Requirement for Admission to the FSEHD for Spring 22

➔ All students in initial teacher certification program must take and pass a **Basic Skills Test (BST)**. Test scores are due when you submit your application for admission to the FSEHD.

FSEHD S22 Admission Applications are due between: December 15, 2021 and January 3, 2022.

- The FSEHD suggests students take the **SAT or ACT** exam.
- Students must meet the required BST scores or fall within the conditional admissions range.
- **Conditional Admissions:** If you fall within the range for math and/or literacy, you are eligible for enrollment in a one-credit content module(s). Continuation in the program will be contingent on completing these modules with a B or higher during the first and/or second semester of your conditional admission. The modules replaces the BST.

What are my first steps?

Step One: Determine if you have taken the SATs or ACTs? If yes,

- a. Locate your scores and determine if they meet the RIC FSEHD required scores or conditional admission range. If you meet the required scores or the conditional range, you are all set. You will upload these scores when you submit your application for admission.
- b. Locating your test scores – See Page 3 under Requesting Test Scores
- c. **FSEHD BST Required Scores and Conditional Ranges Table** – See Page 3

Step Two: If you do not have BST scores or your scores are below the conditional ranges listed on page 3 you will need to take or retake the test.

→ Your scores **must be available during the FSEHD admission period** (Dec.15, 2021 – Jan. 3, 2022).


If I need to take or retake the BST, how do I decide which one to take?

Choosing the Core (PRAXIS): Core Testing Information

To register for the Core: Go to the [ETS PRAXIS](#) home page to create an account. Click here to learn about [PRAXIS Tests and Service Fees](#)

1. On the **My Praxis Home**, follow the steps below to complete the registration process for the Core (Praxis)
2. Steps:
 - a. Register for a Praxis Test and read through all sections.
 - b. Choose **I Agree**, to continue the registration process.
 - c. Complete any background information and continue
 - d. Search Tests and Select **College/University Required Tests**, **NOT** State Agency Required Tests
 - e. **Taking all three tests the same day:** Reading, Writing, and Mathematics: Register for the Core Academic Skills for Educators: Combined Test [5752]
 - f. **Taking the tests on different days:** Register for each one separately using the following codes: Reading [5713], Writing [5723], Mathematics [5733]
 - g. Schedule test taking by zip code.
 - h. If test dates are filled return to **Change Center** and choose a different location.
 - i. Identify Attending Institution, then Score Recipient
 - j. Enter Rhode Island College or the **RIC Code: 3724**
 - k. Check the Box to ensure score is sent to RIC and continue for payment information

Note: If you select to take the Core (PRAXIS) test, The ETS account you create will be used again in preparation for student teaching.

→ Two, in some cases three, Praxis tests will be required before student teaching. See [R.I. test requirements](#) to learn more about tests you will need prior to student teaching. These will be taken later in your program.

Test scores may be mixed

- If you took the SAT and need to retake the mathematics test, you may take the ACT or the Core math test.
- If you took the SAT and need to retake the Reading/Writing test, you may take the ACT Reading and English or Core Reading and Writing tests.
- If you took the ACT and need to retake the mathematics test, you may take the SAT or Core math test.

Additional Information:

Core (Praxis) Test.

- If you haven't taken or need to retake the Core tests, use the new codes listed above when you register for a test.
- FSEHD will accept the discontinued versions of the Core, if you've taken and passed them already.

SATs

- If you took the SATs before January 2016 - [use the SAT score converter](#) to see if your scores meet current admissions requirements. If you use the score converter be sure to submit your original scores and a copy of the score converter page when you submit your application for admission.
